Details of approval

The syllabus is an old version, approved by The pro-dean for First-Cycle Studies at the Faculties of Humanities and Theology on 2022-03-23 and was valid from 2022-03-23, autumn semester 2022.

General Information

The course is offered as a freestanding course. It can be selected as a specialisation course in the Bachelor's programme in Religious Studies and Theology. It can be included in a first or second cycle degree.

Main field of studies

Religious Studies and Theology with specialisation in Studies in Faiths and World Views

Depth of study relative to the degree requirements

G1F, First cycle, has less than 60 credits in first-cycle course/s as entry requirements

Learning outcomes

On completion of the course, the students shall be able to:

Knowledge and understanding

- account for the most important currents, questions and thinkers in the history of ideas of studies in faith and world views
- account for key themes of Christian theology in the past and present
- account for key problems and concepts of the philosophy of religion
- account for key ethical theories from history of ideas and contemporary perspectives

Competence and skills

- interpret and provide reasons for their interpretation of key texts of the history of

- ideas from different eras
- describe and discuss main problems in systematic theology with a certain degree of independence
- apply different perspectives in the discussion of problems of the philosophy of religion with a certain degree of independence
- describe and discuss the situation of humanity based on ethical theories with a certain degree of independence

Judgement and approach

- judge and assess contemporary issues in the specialisations of studies in faith and world views
- critically assess different theories and interpretations in systematic theology, philosophy of religion and ethics in current debates, especially with regard to gender, power and ethnicity

Course content

The course starts with an overview of the manifestations of ethics, philosophy of religion and theology in the history of ideas, and study of representative texts from different periods: Antiquity and the early church, the Middle Ages, the reformation and the modern era. This is followed by an in-depth study of the different subdisciplines of studies in faith and world views. Systematic theology looks at how main themes in Christian theology have been interpreted in both the past and present. Philosophy of religion addresses key areas of contention in philosophy of religion. Adopting different perspectives, including feminist perspectives, the course covers issues relating to the existence of God, different conceptions of knowledge and reality and the relationship between truth and meaning. The ethics component provides an introduction to leading ethical theories, from the perspectives of both the history of ideas and the present, whereupon the theories are applied in a discussion of current ethical issues.

The course consists of four modules:

1. History of Ideas, 6 credits
2. Systematic Theology, 3 credits
3. Philosophy of Religion, 3 credits
4. Ethics, 3 credits

Course design

The teaching consists of lectures and six seminars. All seminars are compulsory. Absence from more than 20% (but no more than 50%) of the seminars is to be compensated for with a written assignment in accordance with the lecturer's instructions. Students who are absent from more than 50% of the seminars must retake the course.

Assessment

The assessment of the module is based on six brief literature essays that are presented at seminars as well as a written assignment.

The assessment of Module 2 is based on a written assignment

The assessment of Module 3 is based on a written assignment.

The assessment of Module 4 is based on a written assignment.

The examiner, in consultation with Disability Support Services, may deviate from the regular form of examination in order to provide a permanently disabled student with a form of examination equivalent to that of a student without a disability.

Grades

Marking scale: Fail, Pass, Pass with distinction.

For the grade of Pass on the whole course, the student must have been awarded this grade for all modules. For the grade of Pass with Distinction on the whole course, the student must have been awarded this grade on at least 10 course credits and the grade of Pass on the remaining credits.

Entry requirements

To be admitted to the course, students must have successfully completed CTRA12/CTRD12 Religious Studies and Theology: Level 1, or the equivalent.
