Details of approval

The syllabus was approved by The pro-dean for First-Cycle Studies at the Faculties of Humanities and Theology on 2023-09-08 (U 2023/620) and was last revised on 2026-03-06 by The Pro Dean of First and Second Cycle Studies at The Joint Faculties of Humanities and Theology (U 2026/118). The revised syllabus comes into effect 2026-03-06 and is valid from the autumn semester 2026.

General information

The course is offered as a freestanding course. It can normally be included in a general qualification for both first and second-cycle studies.

Learning outcomes

On completion of the course, the student is to be able to:

Knowledge and understanding

- account for the main characteristics of German morphology in Swedish,
- account for typical lexical and grammatical features of German technical language in Swedish,

Competence and skills

- understand simple and intermediate authentic German texts of a general nature,

- understand the central contents of selected technical German texts in different subject areas,

Judgement and approach

- identify their need for additional knowledge and develop their specialised German language skills.

Course content

The course includes the study of German grammar and reading of general and technical German texts. The grammar includes central morphology and certain syntactic phenomena with special relevance for German technical language. Through reading, the students improve their ability to understand German texts. Special weight is placed on technical texts in the later parts of the course.

The course consists of two modules:

- 1) Grammar and Text, 7.5 credits
- 2) Texts from Specific Fields, 7.5 credits

Course design

The course is offered as a distance learning course and utilises a web-based learning platform and/or digital tools. Students are required to participate on this basis and have access to a computer with an internet connection and a loudspeaker, microphone and web camera. The department will provide information about the technical requirements.

Assessment

Assessment is based on one written examination per module.

The assessment is based on a camera monitored examination using live streaming. Camera monitoring takes place in real time. No recording takes place. Live monitoring is required in order to assess the student's knowledge without the student having access to any aids.

The examiner, in consultation with Disability Support Services, may deviate from the regular form of examination in order to provide a permanently disabled student with a form of examination equivalent to that of a student without a disability.

Grades

Grading scale includes the grades: Fail, Pass, Pass with distinction
For the grade of Pass on the whole course, the student must have been awarded at least this grade on all modules. For a grade of Pass with Distinction on the whole course, the student must have been awarded this grade on at least 7.5 credits and a grade of Pass on the remaining credits.

Entry requirements

General requirements and studies equivalent to Swedish Upper Secondary School course German 3/German Further level 1
