Details of approval

The syllabus was approved by The pro-dean for First-Cycle Studies at the Faculties of Humanities and Theology on 2022-05-10. The syllabus comes into effect 2022-05-10 and is valid from the autumn semester 2022.

General information

The course is offered as a freestanding course. It can normally be included in a first or second-cycle degree.

Learning outcomes

On completion of the course, the students shall be able to:

Knowledge and understanding

- understand and describe the content of simple dialogues and texts in Ukrainian
- describe some basic grammatical constructions in the Ukrainian language

Competence and skills

- use the Ukrainian Cyrillic script writing system
- understand and use some commonly occurring phrases and expressions in Ukrainian, orally and in writing
- ask and answer questions in common everyday situations

- express themselves in Ukrainian, orally and in writing, in very familiar and well delimited areas.

Judgement and approach

- discuss issues related to ethnicity, cultural interaction and cultural diversity.

Course content

The course is based on the study of simple dialogues and texts in Ukrainian using basic vocabulary and grammar. Strong emphasis is placed on communication skills. The student practices oral and written language skills in exercises for listening comprehension, reading, writing and conversation.

Course design

The teaching consists of lectures, lessons and exercises.

Assessment

Assessment consists of a written exam in Canvas and an oral test using real-time streaming (no recording takes place).

The examiner, in consultation with Disability Support Services, may deviate from the regular form of examination in order to provide a permanently disabled student with a form of examination equivalent to that of a student without a disability.

Grades

Grading scale includes the grades: Fail, Pass, Pass with distinction

To obtain the grade of Pass with Distinction for the course, the grade of Pass with Distinction is required on both the written and oral test.
