UKRA11, Ukrainian Grammar and Language Proficiency I, 7.5 credits

Ukrainsk grammatik och språkfärdighet I, 7,5 högskolepoäng First Cycle / Grundnivå

Details of approval

The syllabus was approved by The Pro Dean of First and Second Cycle Studies at The Joint Faculties of Humanities and Theology on 2024-04-26 (U 2024/280). The syllabus comes into effect 2024-04-29 and is valid from the autumn semester 2024.

General information

The course is offered as a freestanding course. It can normally be included in a first or second cycle degree.

Language of instruction: English The course is taught in English and Ukrainian.

Main field of study

Specialisation

Learning outcomes

On completion of the course, the students shall be able to

Knowledge and understanding

- describe the core aspects of Ukrainian grammar,
- recognize and explain the specific grammatical and lexical structures of the Ukrainian language,

Competence and skills

• read, retell, and translate simple, authentic Ukrainian texts,

- write simple texts on specific topics,
- apply basic grammatical patterns and structures in both oral and written production,
- use a vocabulary extensive enough to facilitate communication in everyday situations,
- use dictionaries and other relevant reference sources in the studies,

Judgement and approach

- examine and apply cultural and extralinguistic knowledge,
- analyze, discuss, and take a critical stance on linguistic and cultural norms.

Course content

The course is the first sub-course of the level 1 course in Ukrainian. It builds on the Beginners' Course II. The course provides continuous training in practical language skills with a focus on both written and oral production. In addition, students practice reading and understanding simpler Ukrainian texts, as well as identifying and analyzing basic grammatical structures and sentence patterns in various types of texts.

Course design

The teaching consists of lectures, lessons, exercises and 4-6 written assignments.

Submission of all written assignments and at least 50 % attendance is mandatory. Completion takes place in the form of oral or written assessment of missed components.

Assessment

The assessment is based on continuous assessment within the framework of the teaching, as well as a written and oral exam at the end of the course.

The examiner, in consultation with Disability Support Services, may deviate from the regular form of examination in order to provide a permanently disabled student with a form of examination equivalent to that of a student without a disability.

Grades

Grading scale includes the grades: Fail, Pass, Pass with distinction For a grade Pass with distinction on the whole course, the student must have been awarded this grade on at least 85 % of all the exam components.

Entry requirements

General requirements and Ukrainian: Beginners' Course I and II (30 credits), Ukrainian 3 from high school or the equivalent knowledge.
