## UKRA12, Ukrainian Grammar and Language Proficiency II, 7.5 credits

*Ukrainsk grammatik och språkfärdighet II, 7,5 högskolepoäng*  
First Cycle / Grundnivå

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### Details of approval

The syllabus was approved by The Pro Dean of First and Second Cycle Studies at The Joint Faculties of Humanities and Theology on 2024-05-24 (U 2024/360 ). The syllabus comes into effect 2024-06-02 and is valid from the spring semester 2025.

### General information

The course is offered as a freestanding course. It can normally be included in a first or second cycle degree.

### Learning outcomes

On completion of the course, the students shall be able to

#### Knowledge and understanding

- describe the core aspects of Ukrainian morphology and syntax,
- recognize and explain the specific grammatical and lexical structures of the Ukrainian language,

#### Competence and skills

- read, retell, and translate authentic Ukrainian texts,

- write simple texts in Ukrainian on specific topics,
- apply basic grammatical patterns and structures in both oral and written production,
- use a sufficiently extensive vocabulary to facilitate communication in different everyday situations,
- use dictionaries and other relevant reference sources in the studies,

### **Judgement and approach**

- examine and apply cultural and extralinguistic knowledge,
- analyze, discuss, and take a critical stance on linguistic and cultural norms.

### **Course content**

The course provides continuous training in practical language skills with a focus on both written and oral production. In addition, students practice reading and understanding authentic Ukrainian texts, as well as identifying and analyzing basic grammatical structures and sentence patterns in various types of texts. The course is a part of the level 1 course in Ukrainian. It builds on UKRA11.

### **Course design**

The teaching consists of lectures, lessons, exercises and 4-6 written assignments.

Submission of all written assignments and at least 50 % attendance is mandatory. Completion takes place in the form of oral or written assesment of missed components.

### **Assessment**

The assessment is based on a written take-home exam and an oral exam.

The examiner, in consultation with Disability Support Services, may deviate from the regular form of examination in order to provide a permanently disabled student with a form of examination equivalent to that of a student without a disability.

### **Grades**

Grading scale includes the grades: Fail, Pass, Pass with distinction

For a grade Pass with distinction on the whole course, the student must have been awarded Pass with distinction on both the written take-home exam and and the oral exam.

### **Entry requirements**

The equivalent knowledge to UKRA11: Ukrainian Grammar and Language Proficiency I.
