Details of approval

The syllabus was approved by The Pro Dean of First and Second Cycle Studies at The Joint Faculties of Humanities and Theology on 2024-12-11 (U 2024/886). The syllabus comes into effect 2025-01-01 and is valid from the autumn semester 2025.

General information

Subject: Ukrainian

The course is offered as a freestanding course. It can normally be included in a general qualification for first or second-cycle studies.

Language of instruction: English

The course is given in English and Ukrainian.

Main field of study *Specialisation*

- G1F, First cycle, has less than 60 credits in first-cycle course/s as entry requirements

Learning outcomes

On completion of the course, the student shall be able to

Knowledge and understanding

- account for basic stylistic variations in modern Ukrainian texts,
- understand and explain important grammatical structures in the texts,
- understand an intermediate level vocabulary, especially terms related to cultural, historical and social topics,

Competence and skills

- read and translate adapted Ukrainian texts into English,
- analyze and discuss the grammar and vocabulary of the texts, explaining how language choices affect meaning and style,
- apply acquired vocabulary and grammatical structures in discussions and written reflections related to Ukrainian cultural and social contexts,

Judgement and approach

- critically review, discuss and take a position on language norms, and adopt a scholarly approach to language,
- critically assess and reflect on the cultural and historical perspectives presented in texts.

Course content

The course contains knowledge-oriented elements that deepen the understanding of the vocabulary and grammatical structure of the Ukrainian language, and stylistic variations of the texts. The teaching mainly consists of exercises in practical reading comprehension, translation and discussions related to Ukrainian cultural and social contexts. The texts in Ukrainian are selected so as to provide students with both language proficiency and knowledge about Ukrainian history, culture and society.

Course design

The teaching consists of lectures, seminars and 2-3 written assignments. Submission of all written assignments and at least 50 % attendance is mandatory. Completion of missed components is done through oral or written assessment.

Assessment

The assessment is based on a written take-home exam.

The examiner, in consultation with Disability Support Services, may deviate from the regular form of examination in order to provide a permanently disabled student with a form of examination equivalent to that of a student without a disability.

Grades

Grading scale includes the grades: Fail, Pass, Pass with distinction
For the grade Pass on the course, the grade Pass on the take-home exam is required.
For a grade of Pass with Distinction on the course, a grade of Pass with Distinction on the take-home exam is required.

Entry requirements

General eligibility and knowledge corresponding to Ukrainian: Beginners' Course I (UKRB01) and II (UKRB02), 30 credits.
