## UKRB01, Ukrainian: Beginners' Course I, 15 credits

*Ukrainska: Nybörjarkurs I, 15 högskolepoäng*

First Cycle / Grundnivå

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### Details of approval

The syllabus was approved by The pro-dean for First-Cycle Studies at the Faculties of Humanities and Theology on 2022-12-15 and was last revised on 2026-02-24 by The Pro Dean of First and Second Cycle Studies at The Joint Faculties of Humanities and Theology (U 2026/133). The revised syllabus comes into effect 2026-02-26 and is valid from the autumn semester 2026.

### General information

The course is offered as a freestanding course. It can normally be included in a first cycle degree.

### Learning outcomes

On completion of the course, the students shall be able to

#### Knowledge and understanding

- understand and account for the contents of simplified short Ukrainian texts
- identify certain common declension patterns and grammatical constructions in Ukrainian

#### Competence and skills

- use the Ukrainian Cyrillic script writing system
- read and translate simple short texts in Ukrainian

- apply certain common grammatical constructions and write simple sentences in Ukrainian
- participate in familiar everyday conversations in Ukrainian

## **Judgement and approach**

- critically review, discuss and take a position on language norms

## **Course content**

The course is based on a study of simplified dialogues and texts in Ukrainian with elementary vocabulary and basic grammatical structures. The course also includes simple written exercises of everyday situations. Furthermore, students practise Ukrainian pronunciation and oral proficiency in connection with exercises in listening comprehension, pronunciation and conversation.

The course consists of the following modules:

1. Ukrainian: Beginners' Course 1A, 7,5 credits,
2. Ukrainian: Beginners' Course 1B, 7,5 credits.

## **Course design**

The teaching consists of lectures, lessons, exercises and 6-8 mandatory written assignments.

## **Assessment**

Module 1 is assessed on the basis of a written home exam and an oral exam on Zoom.

Module 2 is assessed on the basis of a written home exam and an oral exam on Zoom.

The examiner, in consultation with Disability Support Services, may deviate from the regular form of examination in order to provide a permanently disabled student with a form of examination equivalent to that of a student without a disability.

## **Grades**

Grading scale includes the grades: Fail, Pass, Pass with distinction

For a grade of Pass on the whole course, the student must have been awarded this grade on all modules. For a grade of Pass with Distinction on the whole course, the student must have been awarded this grade on the module Beginners' Course 1B.
