UKRB01, Ukrainian: Beginners' Course I, 15 credits

Ukrainska: Nybörjarkurs I, 15 högskolepoäng First Cycle / Grundnivå

Details of approval

The syllabus was approved by The pro-dean for First-Cycle Studies at the Faculties of Humanities and Theology on 2022-12-15 to be valid from 2023-03-15, autumn semester 2023.

General Information

The course is offered as a freestanding course. It can normally be included in a first or second cycle degree.

Learning outcomes

On completion of the course, the students shall be able to

Knowledge and understanding

- understand and account for the contents of simplified Ukrainian texts at a level that corresponds to CEFR A1
- identify certain common declension patterns and grammatical constructions in Ukrainian

Competence and skills

- use the Ukrainian Cyrillic script writing system
- translate simple sentences from and into Ukrainian
- apply certain common declension patterns and grammatical constructions in speech and writing
- to some extent speak Ukrainian in everyday situations and demonstrate correct

Judgement and approach

• critically review, discuss and take a position on language norms

Course content

The course is based on a study of simplified dialogues and texts in Ukrainian with elementary vocabulary and basic grammatical structures. The course also includes simple written exercises of everyday situations. Furthermore, students practise Ukrainian pronunciation and oral proficiency in connection with exercises in listening comprehension, pronunciation and conversation.

The course consists of the following modules:

- 1. Elementary Ukrainian Grammar I, 7,5 credits,
- 2. Communicative Ukrainian I, 7,5 credits.

Course design

The teaching consists of lectures, lessons and exercises.

Assessment

Module 1 is assessed on the basis of 4 - 6 written assignments and a written home exam.

Module 2 is assessed on the basis of a written assignment and an oral exam.

The examiner, in consultation with Disability Support Services, may deviate from the regular form of examination in order to provide a permanently disabled student with a form of examination equivalent to that of a student without a disability.

Grades

Marking scale: Fail, Pass, Pass with distinction.

For a grade of Pass on the whole course, the student must have been awarded this grade on all modules. For a grade of Pass with Distinction on the whole course, the student must have been awarded this grade on all modules.
