VMFN37, Organisational and Social Work Environment and Mental Health, 7.5 credits

Details of approval

The syllabus was approved by The Master's Programmes Board on 2021-05-11. The syllabus comes into effect 2021-05-18 and is valid from the autumn semester 2021.

General information

The course is given as a second cycle freestanding course and is intended for all those who are interested in the organisational and social work environment and mental health.

Language of instruction: English

Learning outcomes

Knowledge and understanding

On completion of the course, the students shall be able to:

- explain the relationships between organisational and social work environment factors and mental health
- give an account of models and theories of organisational and social work environment factors
- give an account of the importance of a health-promoting balance between work and private life

Competence and skills

On completion of the course, the students shall be able to:

• suggest and argue for different methods for assessing the organisational and social work environment as well as mental health connected to this

- plan and argue for primary preventive and secondary preventive efforts based on their own main field of study at the individual, working group and organisation level
- apply relevant international conventions and agreements for the organisational and social work environment.

Judgement and approach

On completion of the course, the students shall demonstrate the ability to

- reflect on ethical issues related to assessment of, and measures for, individuals, working groups and organisations
- evaluate their own and other actors' roles and responsibilities in assessment and measures connected to the organisational and social work environment

Course content

The course has an interprofessional orientation and aims to deepen knowledge and expertise in mental health connected to the organisational and social work environment from a primary and secondary preventive perspective.

- Assessment methods for the organisational and social work environment and mental illness
- International conventions and agreements for the organisational and social work environment
- Primary and secondary preventive measures
- Systematic work environment management
- Ethical aspects in relation to professional roles, assignments and cooperation
- Diversity, gender equality and discrimination

Course design

The course is interprofessional and conducted remotely. The working methods include both an independent project and group assignments. Compulsory attendance is required for seminars and group assignments.

Assessment

The course is examined through the following assessed components:

Theories of Organisational and Social Work Environment Factors, 1.5 credits: Written group assignment that contains a literature survey of existing theories for organisational and social work environment factors as well as the relationships between these factors and mental health.

Assessment and proposal for measures, 5 credits: Written individual assignment that contains a proposal for relevant assessment instruments, proposals for primary and secondary preventive measures as well as ethical reflections.

Course portfolio, 1 credit: Presentation and critical review of another student's assignment and peer review in groups, and attendance at seminars.

If special circumstances apply, other forms of examination may be applied. .

The examiner, in consultation with Disability Support Services, may deviate from the regular form of examination in order to provide a permanently disabled student with a form of examination equivalent to that of a student without a disability.

Grades

Grading scale includes the grades: Fail, Pass

Entry requirements

The entry requirement is a Degree of Bachelor (180 credits) or equivalent knowledge. A qualification in English, equivalent to English course 6/B from upper-secondary school, is also a requirement.
