The syllabus was approved by The pro-dean for First-Cycle Studies at the Faculties of Humanities and Theology on 2021-06-14 to be valid from 2021-06-14, spring semester 2022.

General Information

The course is a component of the teacher education programme at Lund University.

Language of instruction: Swedish and Italian

Learning outcomes

On completion of the course, the students shall be able to:

Knowledge and understanding

- account for the Italian literary history from the 17th century until the 19th century
- provide an advanced account of the structure of the Italian language and how it is used in different situations
- account for essential components of Italian contemporary history
- account for current research-related information on language teaching

Competence and skills

- debate and discuss, in Italian, current Italian contemporary issues
- use theoretical knowledge to adapt their Italian to the speech situation
- account for selected grammatical and textual phenomena from a contrastive Swedish-Italian perspective

- relate current research-based information on teaching to a specific aspect of teaching Italian as a school subject

Judgement and approach

- relate their subject knowledge and skills acquired in the course to the world around them
- discuss and take a position on issues regarding Italian society and language from different perspectives
- assess their own need for further theoretical and advanced knowledge in the subject.

Course content

The course provides students with advanced written and oral language proficiency and specialised knowledge of the Italian language, Italian literature and Italian society, culture and history. Major emphasis is placed on the study and comprehension of texts. The course also includes didactic seminars with the purpose of introducing students to the future profession.

The course consists of the following modules:

1. Written Italian, 7.5 credits
2. Spoken Italian, 7.5 credits
3. Text Studies and Literary History, 7.5 credits
4. Culture and Society, 7.5 credits

Course design

Two modules (1 and 2) are offered as distance learning modules and two modules are offered on campus. As the course is partly offered as a distance learning course that makes use of an online learning platform and/or digital tools for both teaching and assessment, students are required to participate under these conditions and have access to a computer with an internet connection. The department will provide information about the technical requirements.

The teaching consists of lectures, group exercises and seminars on subject didactics. All components involving proficiency and the seminars on subject didactics are compulsory.

The course has compulsory written assignments (two for Module 1) and oral presentations (one each for Modules 2, 3 and 4).

Assessment

The assessment of Module 1 is based on a written invigilated exam or a monitored online exam. The department will provide information on which alternative applies to the current semester.

The assessment of Module 2 is based on an oral exam on campus or online. The department will provide information on which alternative applies to the current semester.

The assessment of Module 3 is based on a take-home exam.

The assessment of Module 4 is based on a take-home exam.

The examiner, in consultation with Disability Support Services, may deviate from the regular form of examination in order to provide a permanently disabled student with a form of examination equivalent to that of a student without a disability.

Grades

Marking scale: Fail, Pass, Pass with distinction.

For the grade of Pass, the student must have been awarded at least a Pass on all modules. For the grade of Pass with Distinction, the student must have been awarded this grade on at least 18 of the course credits.

Entry requirements

To be admitted to the course, students must have successfully completed 24 credits (of 30 credits) from Italian I.
