Details of approval

The syllabus was approved by The Pro Dean of First and Second Cycle Studies at The Joint Faculties of Humanities and Theology on 2024-12-09 (U 2024/861). The syllabus comes into effect 2025-03-01 and is valid from the autumn semester 2025.

General information

The course is included in the Teacher Education Programme at Lund University.

Language of instruction: Swedish and Italian

Main field of study *Specialisation*

Learning outcomes

On completion of the course, the student shall be able to

Knowledge and understanding

- give an account of the structure of the Italian language and how it is used in different spoken and written situations,
- in Italian, give an account of variation in Italian spoken language,
- in Italian, give a broad account of modern Italian literary history,
- in Italian, describe organisational, political and geographical relations in present-day Italy,
- describe in didactic terms the subject of Italian as a modern language in Swedish schools,

Competence and skills

- apply Italian grammar in speech and writing,
- in Italian, describe and put into context selected Italian literary texts and authors from the twentieth and twenty-first centuries,
- in Italian, analyse and discuss the contents of films and texts of different genres,
- in Italian, analyse and discuss aspects of present-day Italian society,
- relate to current didactic research and to varied teaching elements in the school subject Italian,

Judgement and approach

- identify their own need for additional knowledge and skills in the subject,
- relate to social and political phenomena in Italian society from a regional, national and international perspective.

Course content

The course provides students with training in oral and written language proficiency in Italian, including grammar, vocabulary, pronunciation, listening and speaking, and general knowledge of Italy's language, literature, society, culture and politics. The course also includes didactic seminars with the purpose of introducing students to the future profession.

The course consists of the following modules:

1. Written Italian, 7.5 credits,
2. Spoken Italian, 7.5 credits,
3. Italian literature, 7.5 credits,
4. Culture and Society, 7.0 credits,
5. Language didactic seminars, 0.5 credits.

Course design

Modules 1, 2 and 5 are taught on campus. Modules 3 and 4 are delivered remotely.

Modules 3 and 4 are taught via an online learning platform and digital tools. Students are required to participate on this basis and to have access to a computer with an internet connection and a webcam. The department will provide information about technical requirements.

The teaching consists of lectures, group work, individual practical exercises and didactic seminars.

Module 1 includes a compulsory written assignment.

Assessment

The assessment of Module 4 is based on an invigilated exam at the end of the module.

The assessment of module 2 is based on an oral exam.

Module 3 is examined through an oral presentation and a camera-monitored examination based using real-time streaming,

Module 4 is examined through an oral examination using real-time streaming,

Module 5 is examined through participation in 3-4 language didactic seminars. The examiner may deviate from the regular form of examination if it cannot be implemented during a retake.

The examiner, in consultation with Disability Support Services, may deviate from the regular form of examination in order to provide a permanently disabled student with a form of examination equivalent to that of a student without a disability.

Grades

Grading scale includes the grades: Fail, Pass, Pass with distinction

For the grade of Pass on module 1, a passed written assignment and the grade of Pass on the written examination are required. For Pass with distinction on module 1, the grade of Pass on the written assignment and the grade of pass with distinction on the written examination are required.

The grade of Pass on module 3 requires at least the grade of Pass on both the oral presentation and on the written examination. For the grade of Pass with distinction on module 3, the grade of Pass with distinction is required on both the oral presentation and the written assignment.

The grading scale of Module 5 includes the grades: Fail, Pass. For a pass grade in module 5, participation in the language teaching seminars is required.

For the grade of Pass on the whole course, students must have been awarded at least this grade on all modules. For a grade of Pass with Distinction on the whole course, the student must also have been awarded this grade on at least 22.5 credits, of which 7.5 are from module 1.

Entry requirements

Knowledge equivalent to ÄITD11, Italian 1, 30 credits.
