Details of approval

The syllabus was approved by The pro-dean for First-Cycle Studies at the Faculties of Humanities and Theology on 2023-05-31 to be valid from 2023-09-01, spring semester 2024.

General Information

The course is included in the Teacher Education Programme at Lund University.

Learning outcomes

On completion of the course, the students shall be able to:

Knowledge and understanding

- account for relevant theoretical and methodological connections between research in the subject of Italian and research in educational sciences and teaching practices,

Competence and skills

- apply established reference and citation techniques,
- use appropriate and correct Italian in speech and in writing,
- independently search for scientific sources within educational sciences of

relevance to the teaching of the subject Italian in order to carry out a theoretically grounded analysis,

- plan, design and implement an advanced research project that contributes to knowledge with relevance to educational sciences for Italian teaching,

Judgement and approach

- relate to scientific, social and ethical aspects of their own and others' research project,
- identify their need of additional knowledge and continuing professional development in pedagogical work,
- critically review and evaluate different sources of information in an advanced research project,
- relate the results of an advanced research project to the surrounding society with a focus on the context of schools.

Course content

The course consists of an independent degree project (30 credits) that ties together research in the subject of Italian and educational science research. The work is carried out with the support of a supervisor. In addition to the degree project, the course includes a defence of the independent work and critical review of another student's work.

Course design

In the course, the student writes an individual assignment supported by a supervisor. During the course, the independent project will gradually be discussed at supervision sessions individually and/or in groups, which can include peer review in speech and writing and/or supervision seminars. The independent work will be presented at a final public seminar. Students are expected to participate actively in all supervisory activities and seminars that are organised.

Supervision is limited to thirty hours in the semester in which the student is first enrolled in the course, unless special circumstances apply.

Assessment

The assessment is based on an independent project which is written and, at a public seminar, presented and defended by the student, and on the student's critical review of a fellow student's project. The independent project and the critical review will be assessed by a specially appointed examiner.

Degree projects awarded a grade of Pass at the Faculties of Humanities and Theology can be registered in the LUP Student Papers database if the student so wishes. The student is responsible for ensuring that the version of the degree project that has been assessed and approved is the one uploaded to LUP Student Papers (in PDF format).

The examiner, in consultation with Disability Support Services, may deviate from the regular form of examination in order to provide a permanently disabled student with a form of examination equivalent to that of a student without a disability.

document.

Grades

Marking scale: Fail, Pass, Pass with distinction.

The grade on the independent project decides the grade on the whole course in accordance with the relevant grading criteria.

Entry requirements

Admission to the course requires 90 passed credits in the subject of Italian with didactic specialisation and 45 credits in educational science core courses or an equivalent discipline.
