Details of approval

The syllabus was approved by The pro-dean for First-Cycle Studies at the Faculties of Humanities and Theology on 2018-03-20 to be valid from 2018-03-20, autumn semester 2017.

General Information

The course is included in the Master's programme in Secondary Education offered jointly by Lund and Kristianstad universities.

Language of instruction: English, Swedish and Chinese

Main field of studies

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Depth of study relative to the degree requirements

G2F, First cycle, has at least 60 credits in first-cycle course/s as entry requirements

Learning outcomes

On completion of the course, the students shall be able to

Knowledge and understanding

- account for specialised theoretical knowledge of Chinese in speech and writing
- describe and reflect on a chosen issue of Chinese subject didactics
- demonstrate knowledge of the new school curricula for Chinese in connection with the seminars

Competence and skills

- demonstrate skills approximately matching the requirements of level 5 in the Chinese proficiency test HSK (Hanyu Shuiping Kaoshi), corresponding to level C1 ("Effective operational proficiency") according to CEFR
- demonstrate a good ability to speak and write Chinese, and to translate and summarise spoken and written Chinese at a level of medium difficulty
- put together a thoroughly considered semester plan for a course in Chinese in secondary or upper secondary school, including examinations well aligned with the learning outcomes
- complete an independent project in Chinese subject didactics

Judgement and approach

- discuss and take a critical position on issues concerning cultural encounters and modern Chinese society
- reflect on the expectations, difficulties and development of learners of Chinese
- reflect on their own development in Chinese subject didactics and identify their need of further knowledge.

Course content

The course consists of the following modules:

1. Chinese Fiction and Non-Fiction, 15 credits
2. Subject-Specific Didactics for Chinese 3, 5 credits
3. Project in Subject-Specific Didactics for Chinese, 10 credits

Module 1 is based on reading and grammatical study of fiction and nonfiction focusing on modern usage. The resources for study and discussion may also include image and audio material. Students will be able to practise both listening comprehension and written and oral presentation. Furthermore, the students will practise analysing and interpreting written Chinese while working on an independent project based on Chinese sources. Module 2 includes teaching of theories and methods for the field of the project. The module comprises two lectures on subject didactics, group exercises and seminars aiming to introduce the students to the profession as teachers in Chinese. Module 3 includes teaching of theories and methods for the project work in subject didactics.

Course design

The teaching consists of lectures, group exercises, seminars and supervision, of which the group exercises (3) and seminars (2) in module 2 are compulsory.

Assessment

The assessment of module 1 is based on an invigilated written exam.

The assessment of module 2 is based on a written assignment and an oral presentation in the form of a trial lesson (approximately 30 minutes).

The assessment of module 3 is based on the independent work that is to be discussed and defended at a seminar.

The examiner, in consultation with Disability Support Services, may deviate from the regular form of examination in order to provide a permanently disabled student with a form of examination equivalent to that of a student without a disability.

Grades

Marking scale: Fail, Pass, Pass with distinction.

To be awarded a grade of Pass on the whole course, the student must have been awarded this grade on all modules. To be awarded a grade of Pass with Distinction on the whole course, the student must have been awarded this grade on module 1 and 3, and at least the grade of Pass on the remaining credits.

Entry requirements

To be admitted to the course, students must have passed ÄKIA22 or the equivalent.
